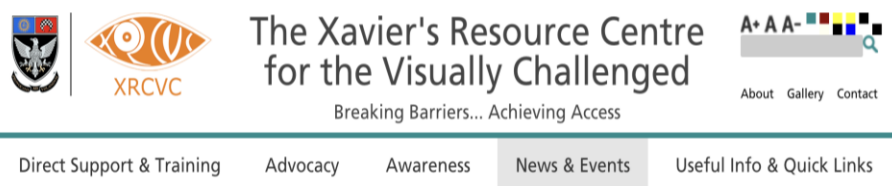

# 1 Introduction

## 1.1 Organizational Profile

### 1.1.1 About XRCVC



The Xavier's Resource Centre for the Visually Challenged (XRCVC) is an integral part and department of St. Xavier's College - Autonomous, Mumbai.

The XRCVC was started in 2003 as an effort to ensure an inclusive environment at St. Xavier's College, for its students with blindness and low vision. Having created an inclusive set-up for its own students, keeping with the college's long tradition of creating social impact within the larger community, the XRCVC has today become a national advocacy and support centre for the blind and low-vision across the city and the country. The XRCVC is committed to giving the best to the students and is always exploring possibilities of opening up more facilities for students.

Access to information for education, leisure or work is one of the biggest requirements for all students especially for persons with print disabilities. Persons with blindness, weak eyesight or any other disability cannot read the standard print books and they need books in different formats. The XRCVC has books in different accessible formats. These include DAISY audio, DAISY full text, EPUB, Word format (DOC/DOCX), HTML, BRF (Braille ready files), Text and RTF (Braille ready files).

The XRCVC through its years of work has an existing database of a rich resource bank. It has a catalogue of books in the e-Library. These books are made available to the students in collaboration with Sugamaya Pusthkalaya.

### 1.1.2 About Sugamaya Pusthakalaya



Sugamaya Pusthakalaya is India 's first and largest online library for collection of accessible books. If you are looking for books accessible to the blind, people with low vision or to persons with any other print disability, this library of libraries is your one-stop shop.

Sugamya Pustakalaya is a collaborative effort of TCS, Daisy Forum of India and NIEPVD(National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities) and Government of India to end the book famine faced by people with print disabilities.

Here, you can access books in diverse languages from various libraries across India. We have also partnered with international agencies like Bookshare and Accessible Books Consortium to provide you with accessible books from all over the world.

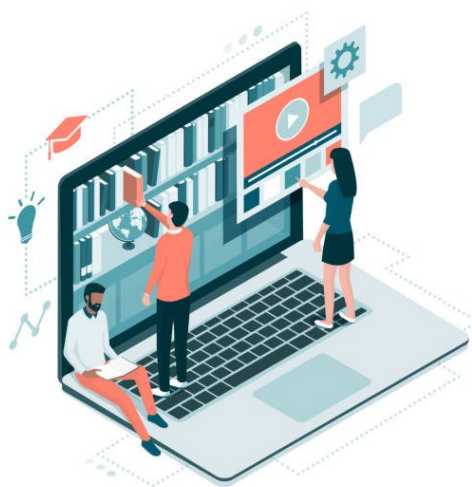
Users can access a collection of over 6,53,234 books, maintain their individual reading shelves online and also download books in chosen formats.

Sugamya Pustakalaya is a National Library for Persons with Disabilities.

## 1.2 Introduction to Project

Currently the XRCVC does not have its own system to manage their books and library. Our purpose of this project is to design and develop an e-library system for the XRCVC.

The XRCVC e-Library System project aims to design and develop a comprehensive and user-friendly digital library system for XRCVC. The project seeks to replace the current manual system of managing books with an automated system that will help both students and staff to easily manage and retrieve information about the books available in the library.



As the name suggests, the e-Library System project has been developed as an online digital library to store the information about books in the library electronically. Users would be able to request books from the XRCVC and download accessible books directly from Sugama Pustakalaya. Along with the online website, an Android App has been developed for quick access to the library from the mobile phones.

The primary benefit of the e-Library System is that it will reduce manual work to a great extent and streamline library activities. Students will be able to search for and request books online, while staff members will be able to manage book requests and update the library catalogue in real-time. This will significantly improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the library operations.

## 2 System Study

### 2.1 Overview

An online website for the e-Library has been developed that could be accessed via the XRCVC website. All the book information would be maintained in a Library Database. Students would be able to browse the website and search for the required books. They can then fill in a request form and request for the books that they would like to read. Administrators would be able to view these book requests and provide the details. They would also be able Add/Edit/Delete Book Details using the website.

The entire website would be Accessible so that users with disabilities would be able to browse the site easily using assistive technologies like screen readers.

Additionally, an Android App also has been developed for students and staff to quickly access the website from their mobile phones.

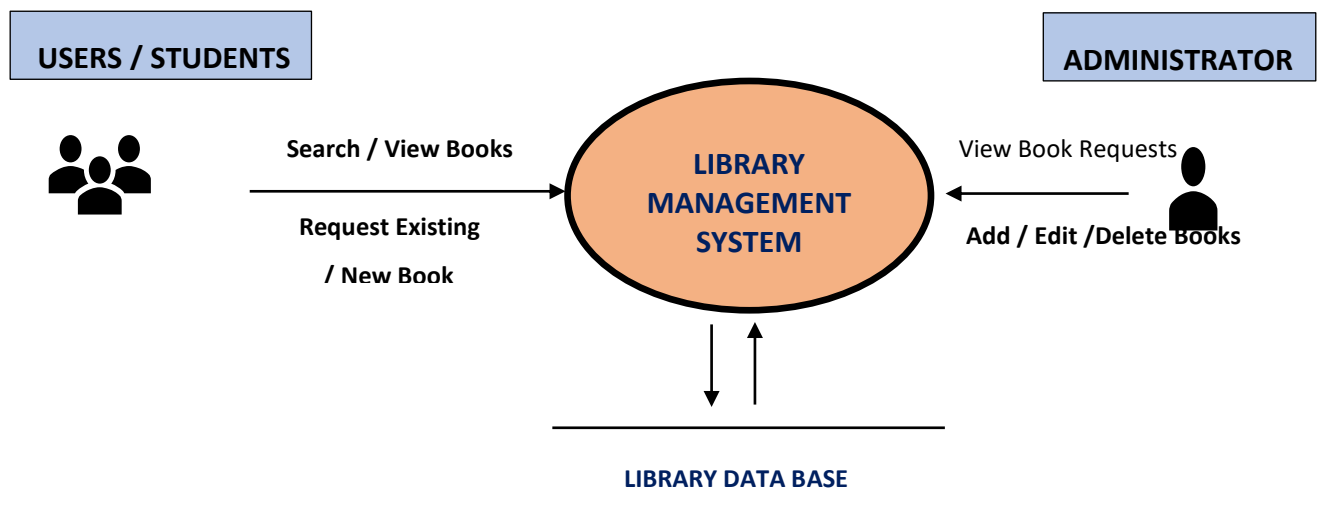


Figure 2-1 Data Flow Diagram

## 2.2 Current System & Limitations

At Present XRCVC uses an Excel based database containing list of all the books that XRCVC offers at the Centre. This Excel spreadsheet is uploaded and updated regularly on XRCVC's Website.

There are several limitations to the present system which are listed below:

- Every time users have to download the spreadsheet to get the updated list from the website to view and request books.
- Library catalogue does not get updated in real time so users may not be able to view the most up-to-date list of books.
- Users need to manually send emails to XRCVC and there is no automated system for managing book requests from users.
- This makes it very cumbersome and difficult for both users and staff members to manage the list of books and requests made by the user.
- Moreover, if students have any specific books that needs to be converted to accessible formats, the current system does not accommodate for such a requirement. Students must send emails personally to the XRCVC.
- An Excel based database does not Account for a robust, sorting, searching and filtering mechanism which makes it time consuming for users to get the desired book from XRCVC.

Overall, the current process is time-consuming and inefficient as there is no centralized system for managing requests. This causes significant inconvenience and delay for students seeking accessible books.

## 2.3 Proposed System & Advantages

The proposed centralized online platform for XRCVC's library of accessible books aims to address the limitations of the current system and provide a more efficient and user-friendly experience for both staff and users. This project implements an online website that allows for real-time updates, automated book requests, and efficient management of requests for converting specific new books to accessible formats. Additionally, a more user-friendly interface with robust search and filtering capabilities would make it easier for students to find the books they need.

Some of the key features of the platform include:

- A comprehensive database of available books with information on authors, publishers, ISBN, formats, and language.
- A search system for the e-library that allows users to quickly find the books they need.

- An easy-to-use administration system that allows the XRCVC staff to add, update, and delete information in the system as needed.
- Elimination of the need for users to download an Excel spreadsheet to view the book list.
- Real-time updates of the library catalogue, ensuring that users always have access to the most up-to-date information.
- An automated system for new book requests that eliminates the need for users to send emails to the XRCVC.
- The ability for users to download accessible books from the National Library for persons with disabilities, Sugamya Pustakalaya.

By implementing these features, the new platform would significantly reduce the inconvenience and delay experienced by students seeking accessible books. Users would be able to search and request books online, and the real-time updates would ensure that they always have access to the latest information. Overall, the new platform would provide a more efficient, user-friendly, and accessible experience for students with disabilities who rely on XRCVC's library services.

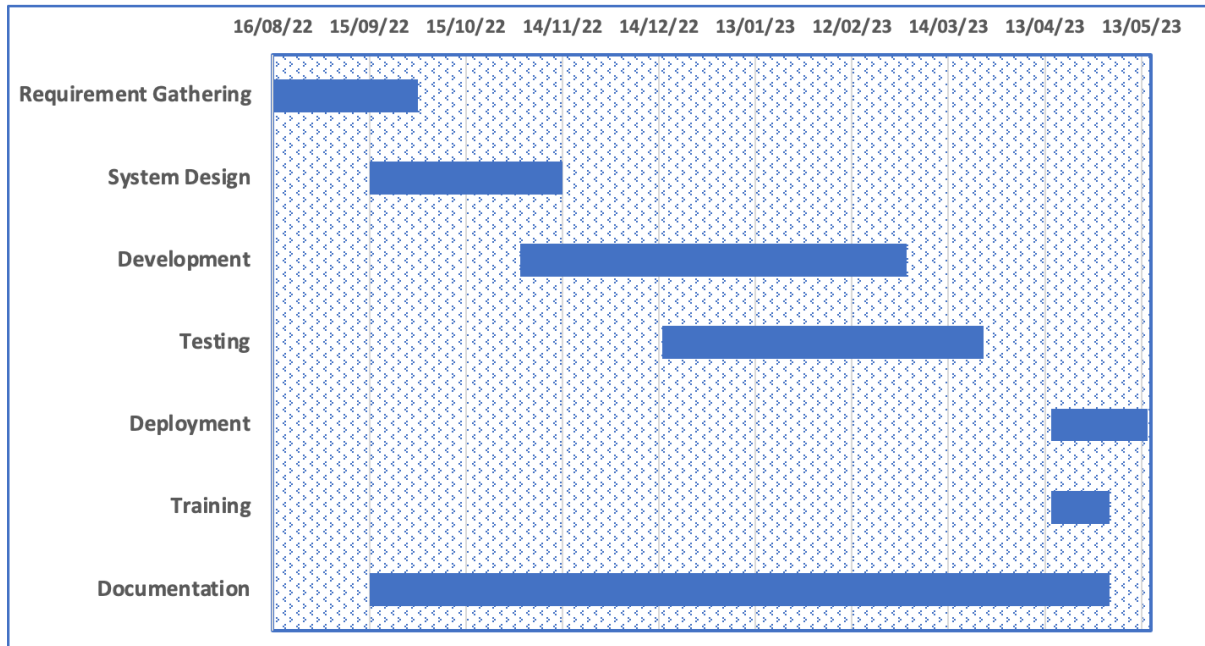


Figure 3-1 Gantt Chart

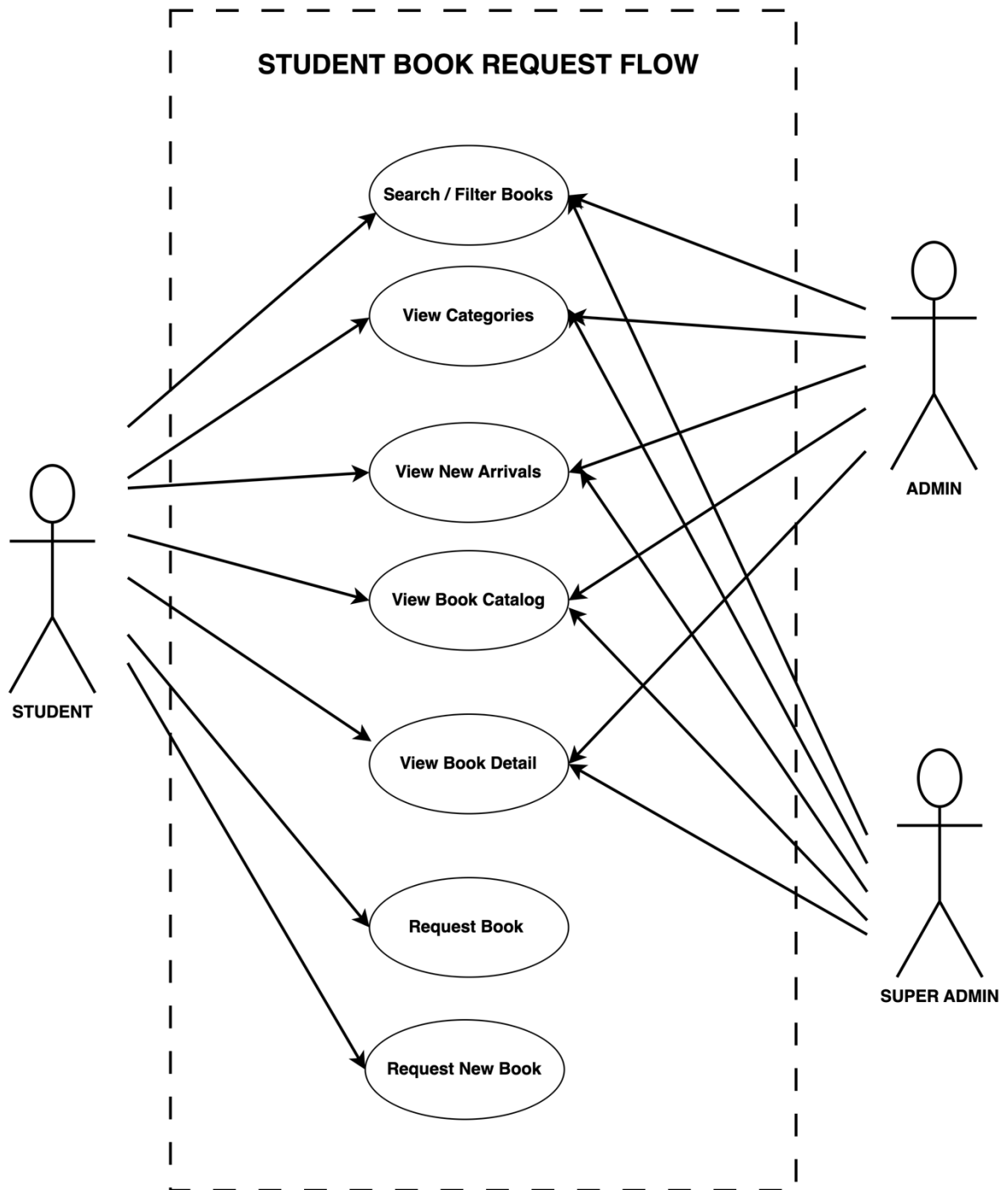


Figure 3-2 Student Book Request Flow use case

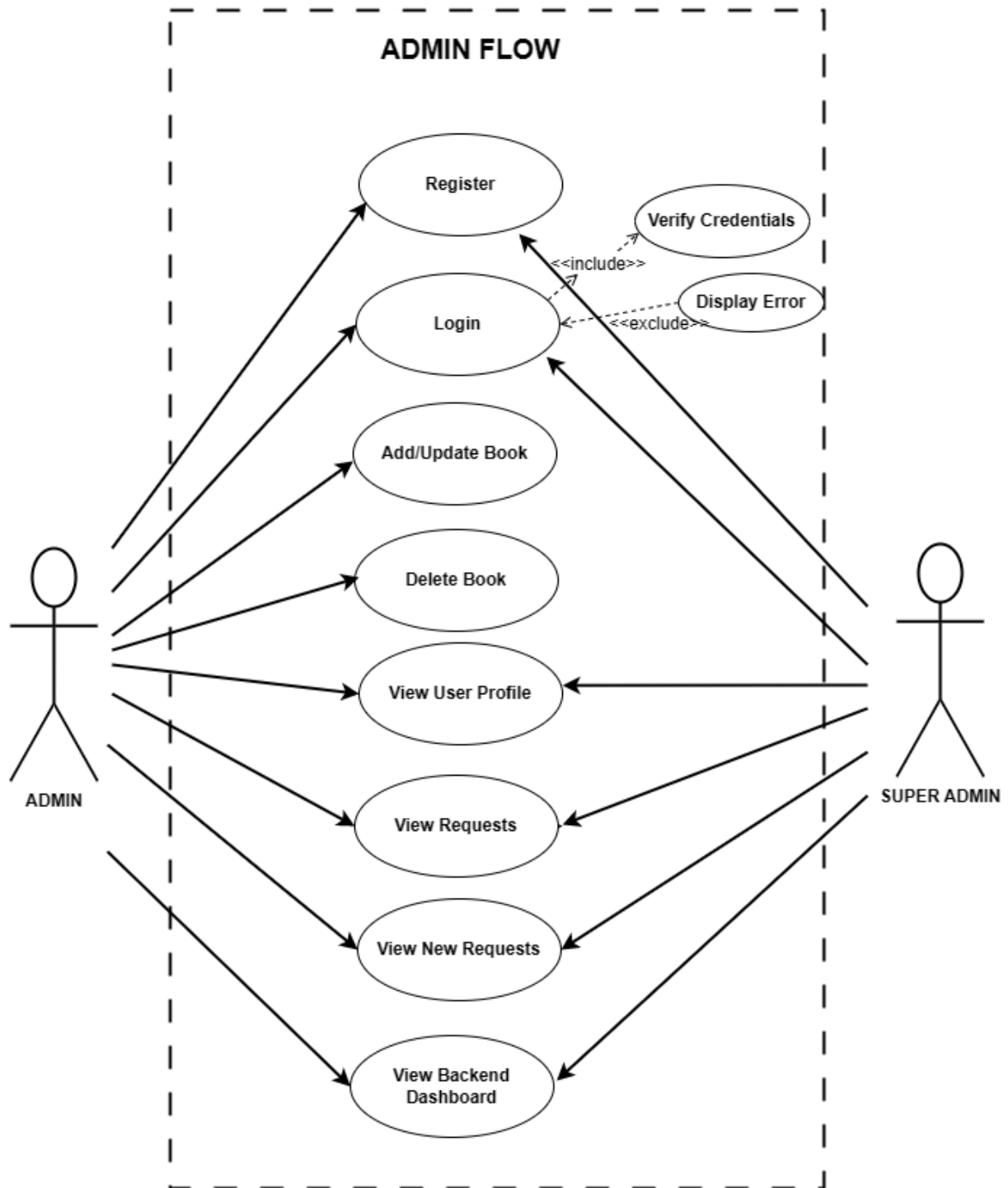


Figure 3-3 Admin Flow Use Case

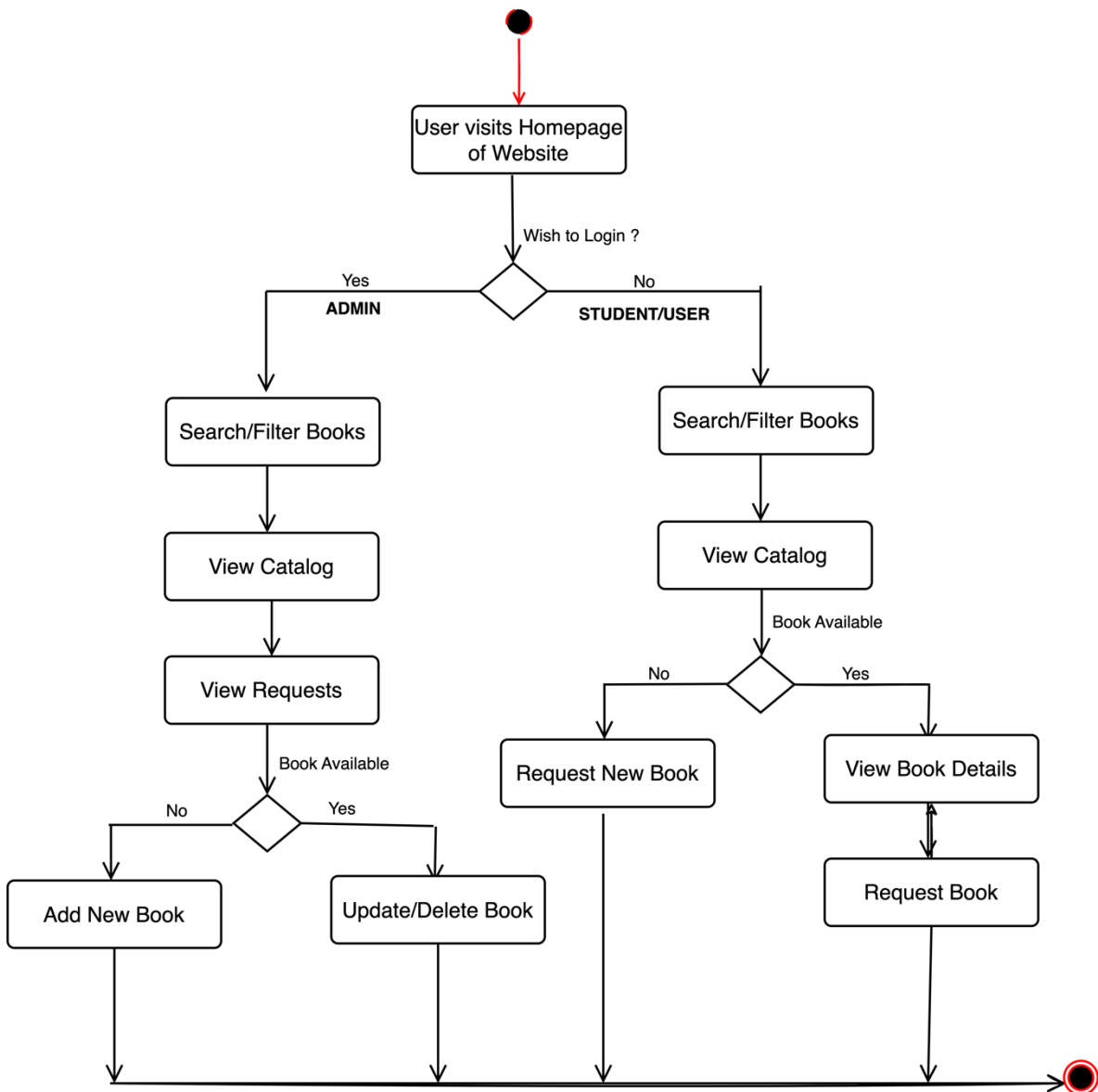


Figure 3-4 Activity Diagram

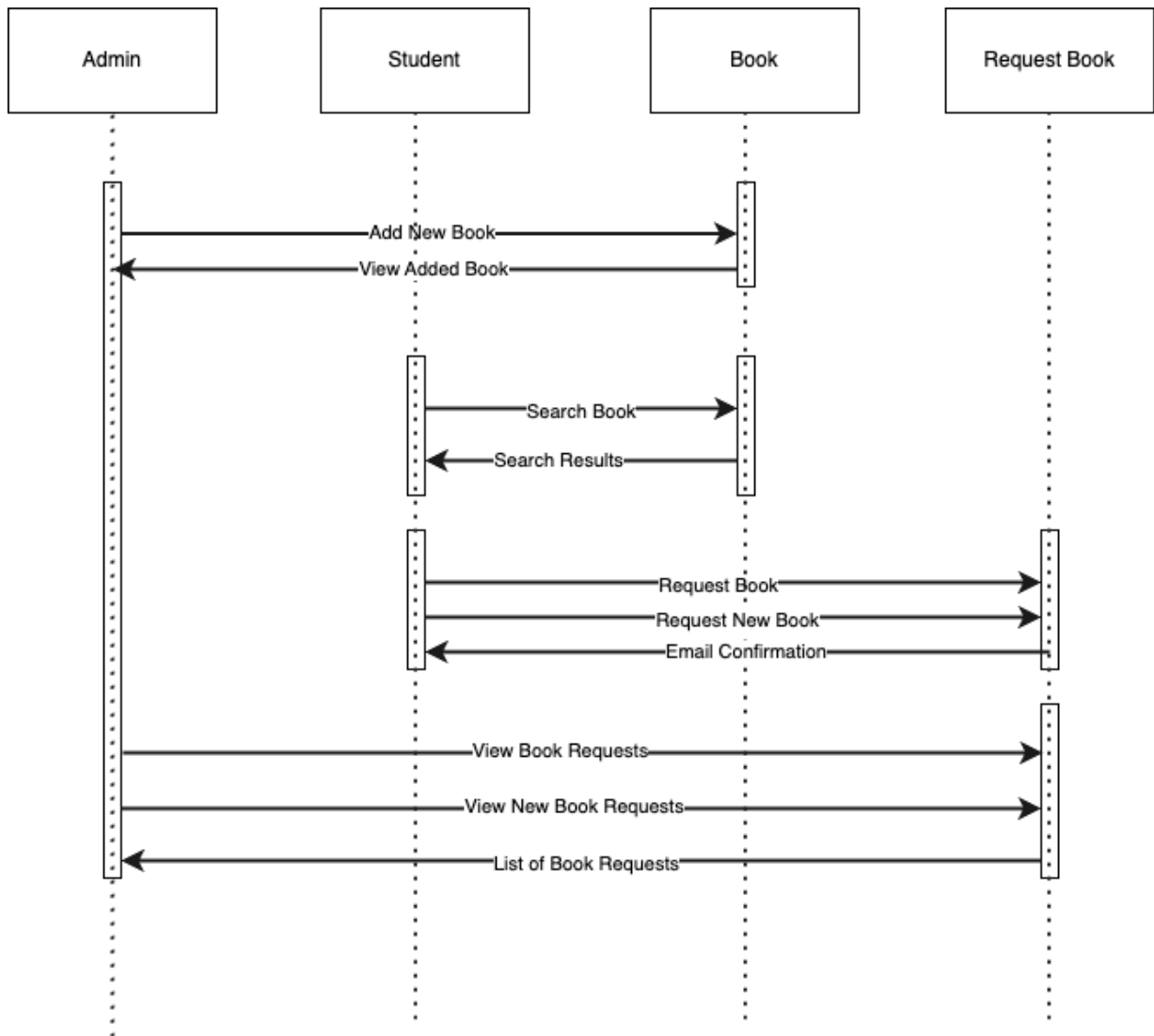


Figure 3-5 Sequence Diagram

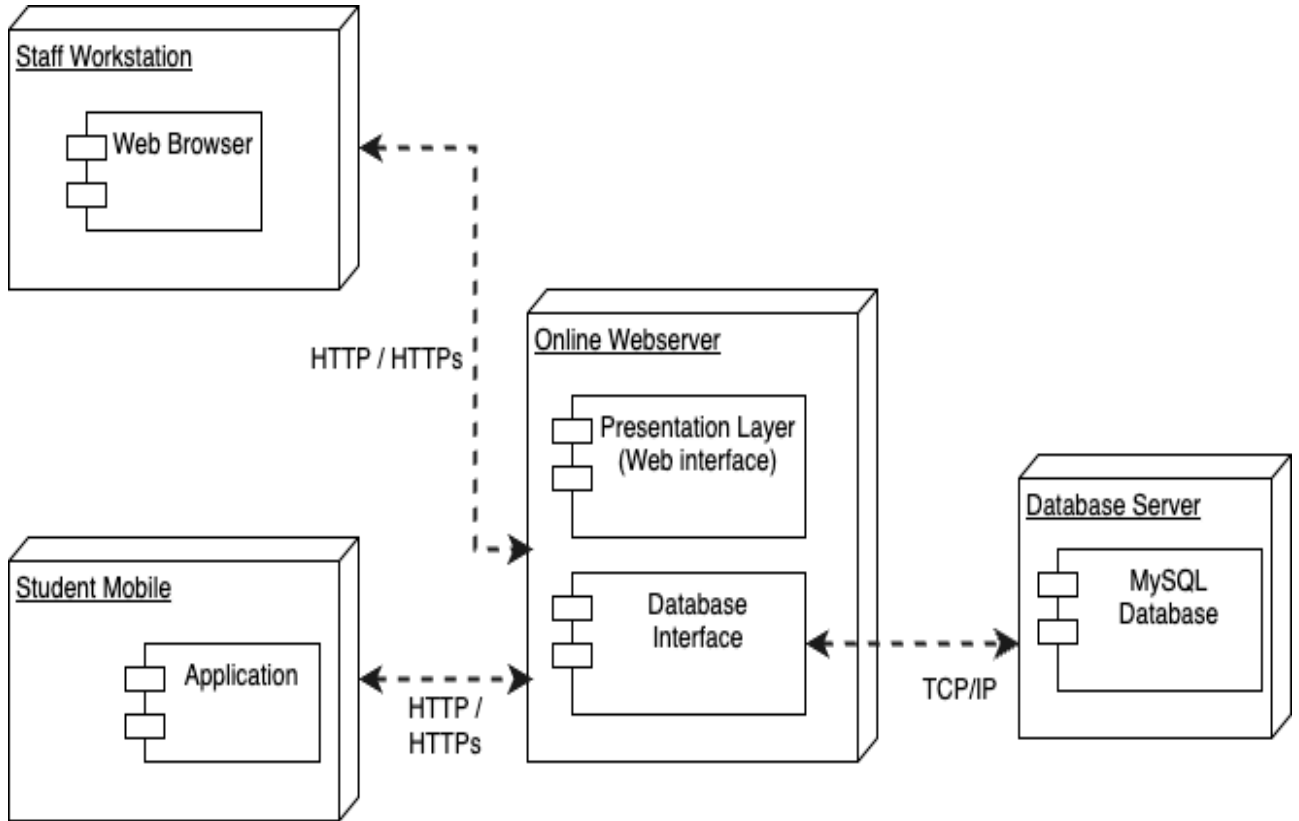


Figure 3-6 Deployment Diagram

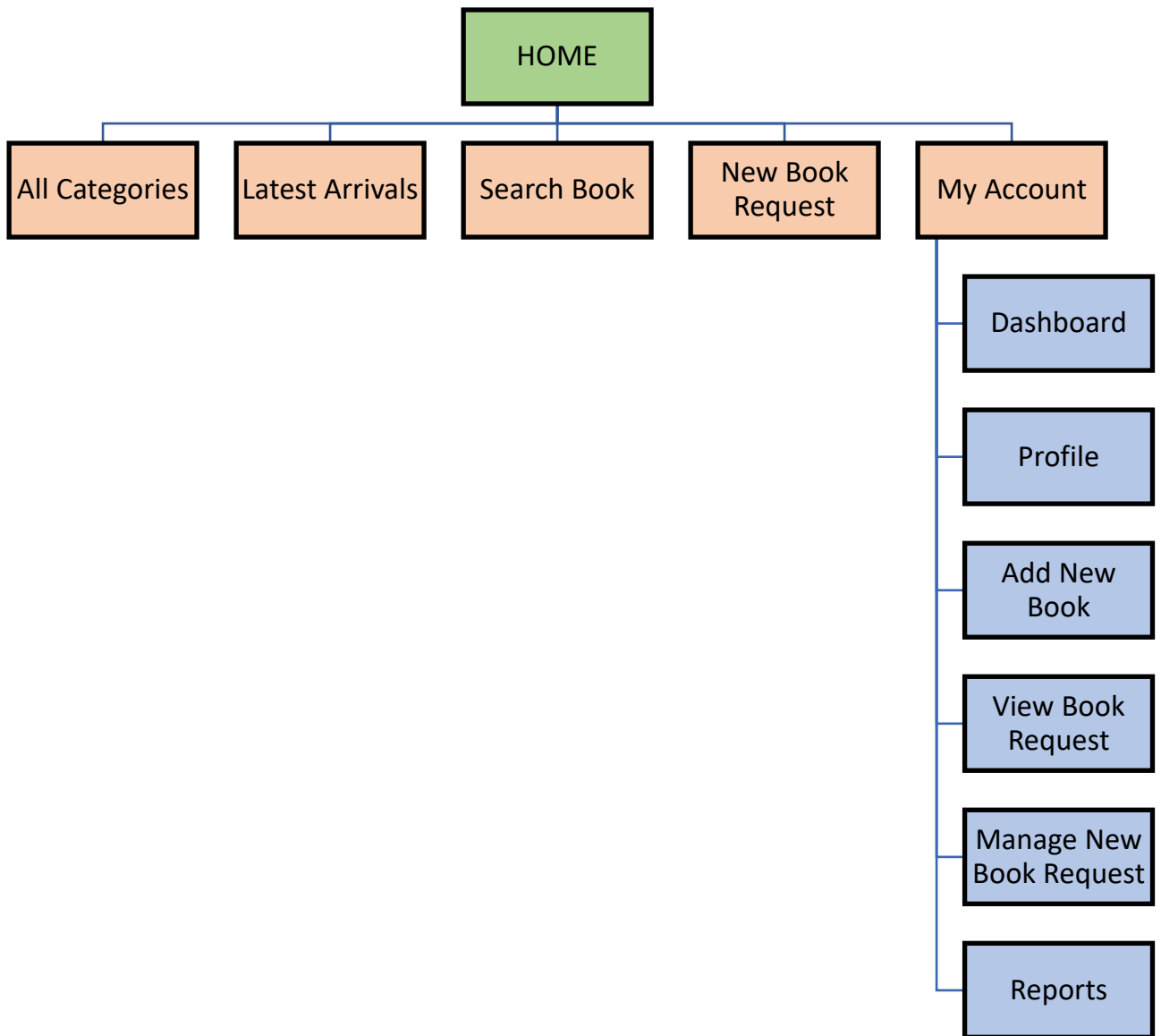
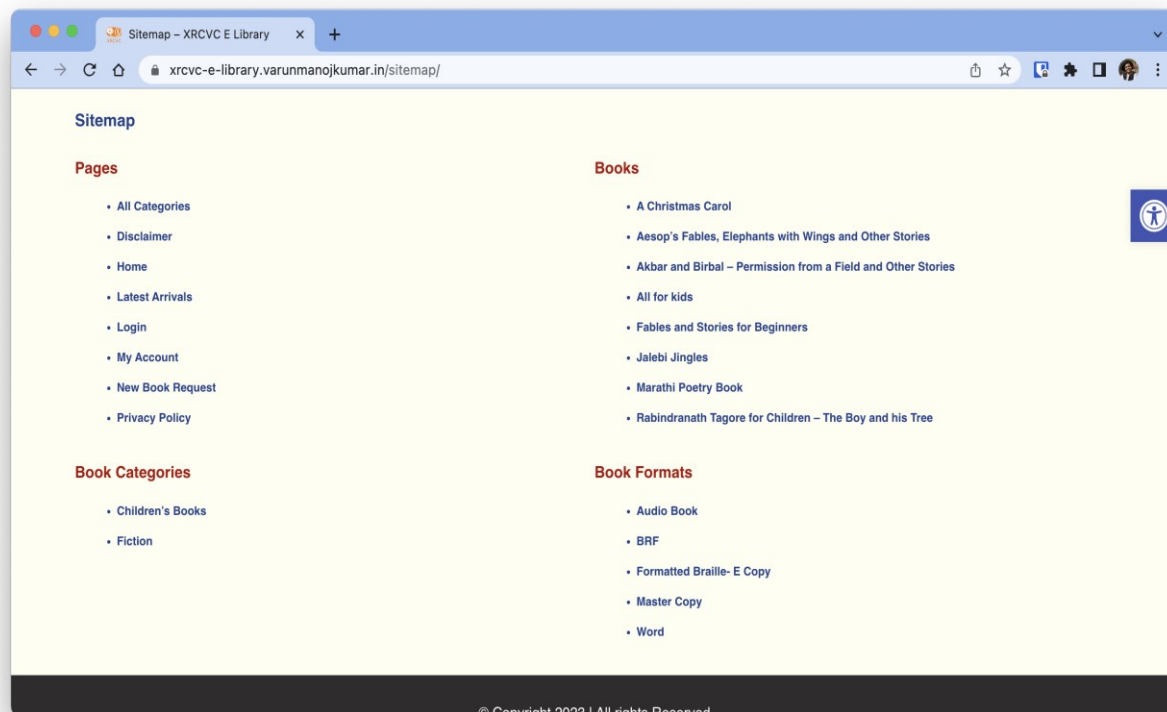


Figure 3-7 Website Menu Tree

## 4 System Design

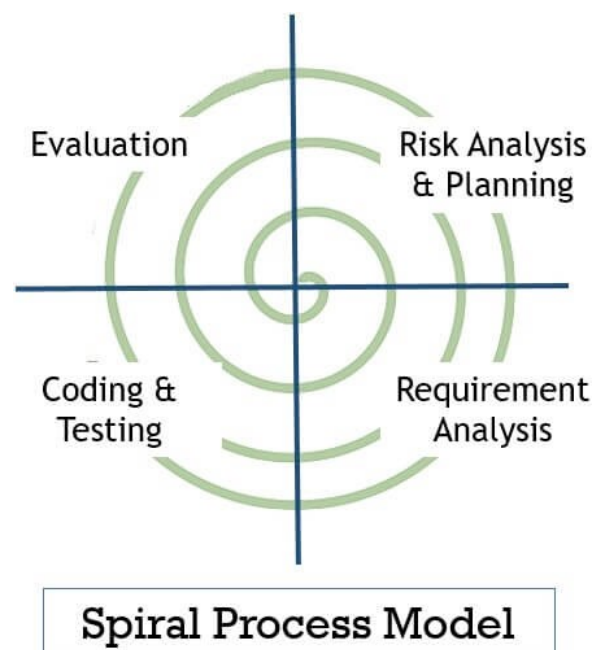
### 4.1 SDLC Process Used

In this project, the SPIRAL MODEL of SDLC has been followed.

Originally proposed by Barry Boehm, the *spiral model* is an evolutionary software process model that couples the iterative nature of prototyping with the controlled and systematic aspects of the waterfall model. It provides the potential for rapid development of increasingly more complete versions of the software.

The spiral development model is a *risk-driven process model* generator that is used to guide multi-stakeholder concurrent engineering of software intensive systems. It has two main distinguishing features. One is a *cyclic* approach for incrementally growing a system's degree of definition and implementation while decreasing its degree of risk. The other is a set of *anchor point milestones* for ensuring stakeholder commitment to feasible and mutually satisfactory system solutions.

Using the spiral model, software is developed in a series of evolutionary releases. During early iterations, the release might be a model or prototype. During later iterations, increasingly more complete versions of the engineered system are produced.



## Phases of Spiral Model

In the spiral model each cycle or iteration has to pass through the four general steps which are as follows:

### 1. Risk Analysis & Planning

Developers identify risks involved in the current iteration and also corrective measures to minimize risk. Then they evaluate corrective measures against objectives and constraints. Thus the deadline is set for the next stage.

### 2. Requirement Analysis

This phase analyses the client's requirements. Also, the requirements for developing the product are also established.

### 3. Coding & Testing

Developers develop multiple programs and integrated them to form a software or prototype. Like, in the early cycles the product of this stage would be a prototype. In subsequent cycles, the product of this stage becomes **developed software**.

The product of this stage is tested to find any error in coding.

### 4. Evaluation

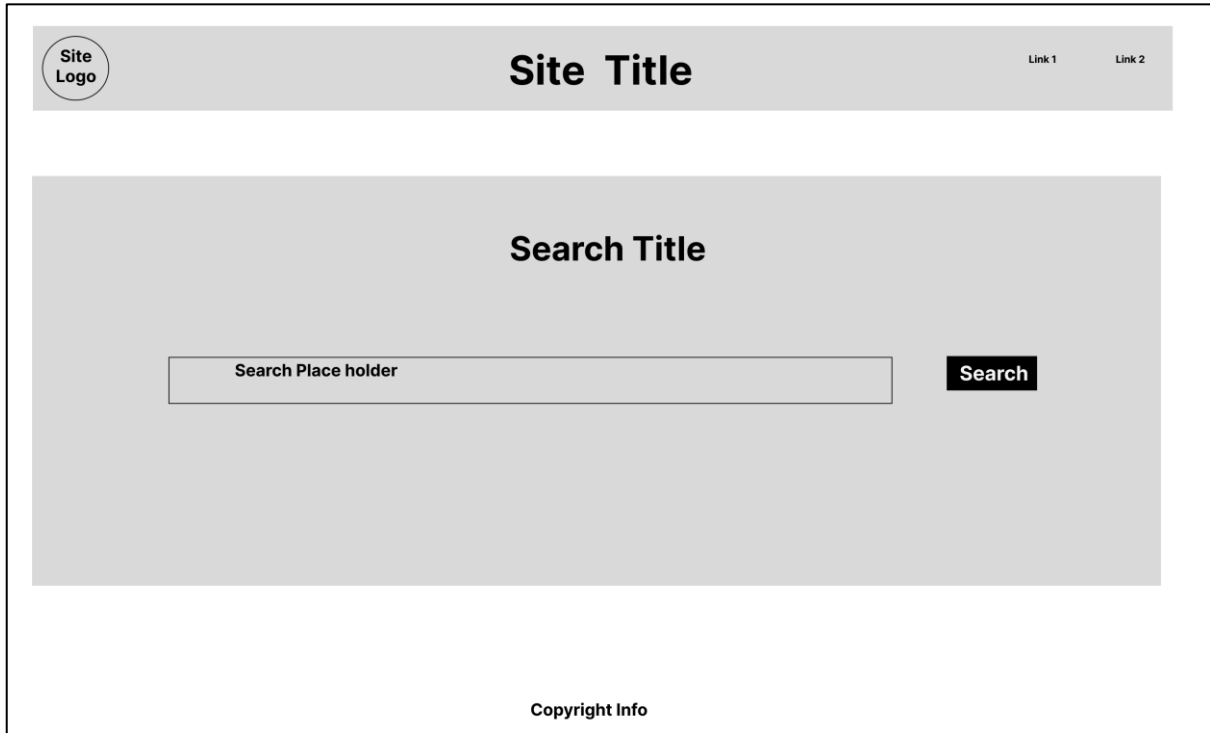
This stage evaluates whether the project is going as per planning or not. It evaluates whether the objective set at the first stage has been achieved or not. The evaluation phase also helps developers decide the number of cycles required to complete the project.

The spiral model allows using other process models in one or more of its cycles. This is either to reduce the risk at some stage or to get the requirements of the user clear or for resolving technical risks.

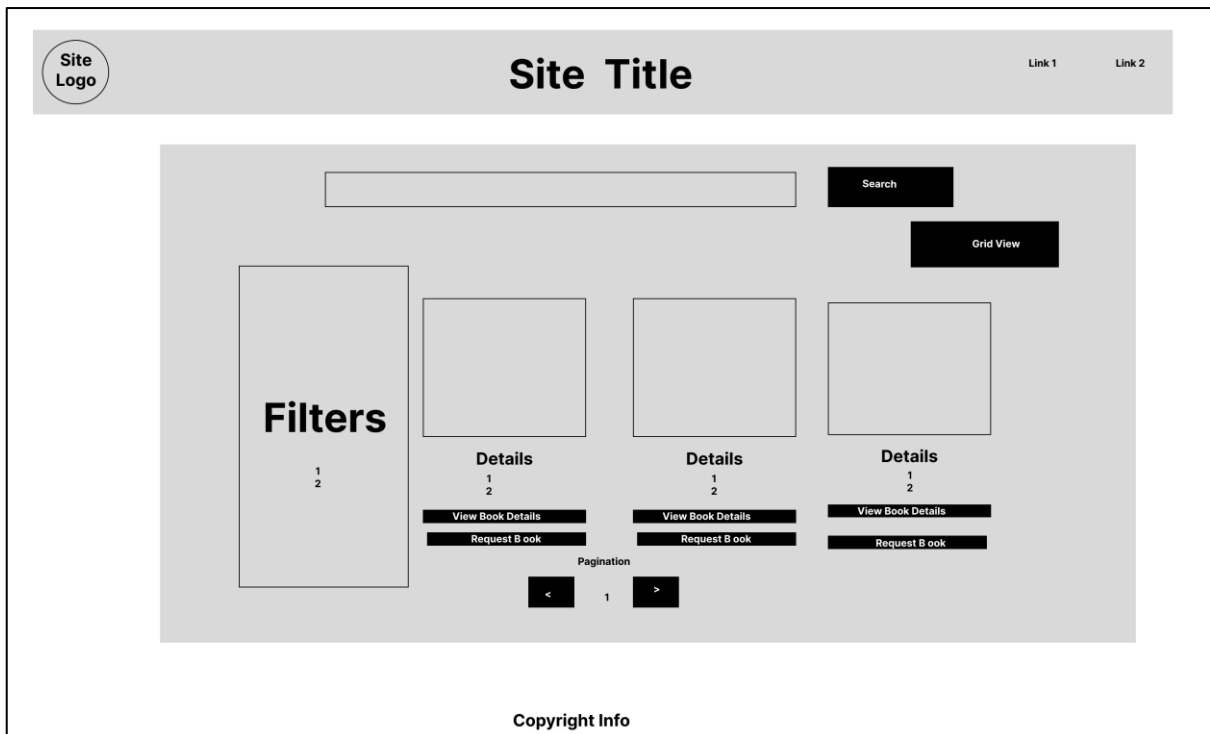



### 4.3 Accessible Design



Accessible means a person with a disability is afforded the opportunity to acquire the same information, engage in the same interactions, and enjoy the same services as a person without a disability in an equally effective and equally integrated manner, with substantially equivalent ease of use. A person with a disability must be able to obtain the information as fully, equally, and independently as a person without a disability.

To design for accessibility means to be inclusive to the needs of all users. Accessible design is the idea that websites should be built so everybody can use them – no matter what their age, impairment, or situation.

It means simplifying your website so it's easily navigable by those using screen readers; removing links that use colour, to convey their clickability for those who are colour blind; ensuring you use a large enough font size for people with low vision.

And with over one billion people worldwide suffering from a disability that affects how they use the web, accessible web design is a necessity in today's world to ensure equal opportunities and access for all. Autism, colour blindness, paralysis; there are plenty of reasons why someone may struggle to use the internet, so ensuring the site has an accessible web design is key to creating inclusive web experiences.

Our project website has been developed for the XRCVC and hence we have taken special efforts to make it accessible specially for the visually challenged.



## 4.4 What we have done to make site accessible

### 4.4.1 REM Units

We want to provide users with low vision a way to choose how fonts are displayed. They should have the ability to increase the size by say 200% while maintaining readability and avoiding content collisions and overlaps.

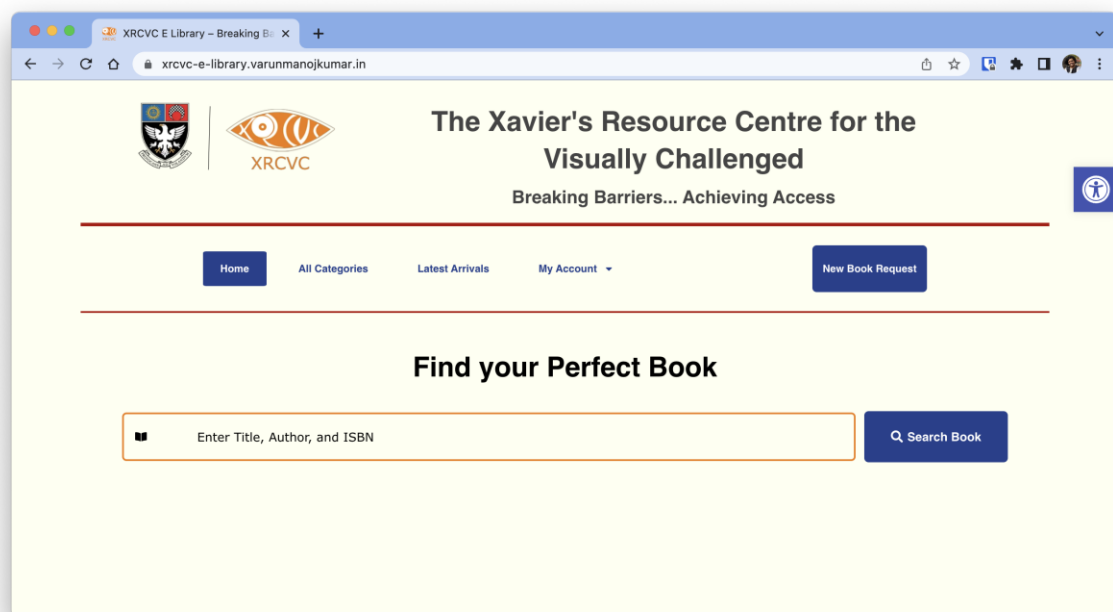
Of the many HTML styling options that CSS enables, font size is a crucial property — especially when it comes to display responsiveness. Moreover, there are several ways to dictate font size using CSS. Of these, rem units prove to be exceptionally flexible and relatively intuitive.

Rem units allow you to set sizes relative to the root element. Therefore, they are different from other sizing alternatives like em units — which depend on a parent element — or percentages, whose real values depend on the property on which they are used.

When building accessible websites, you should avoid using pixels to size font elements. Their absoluteness means they are not scalable. Instead, opt for rems and ems.

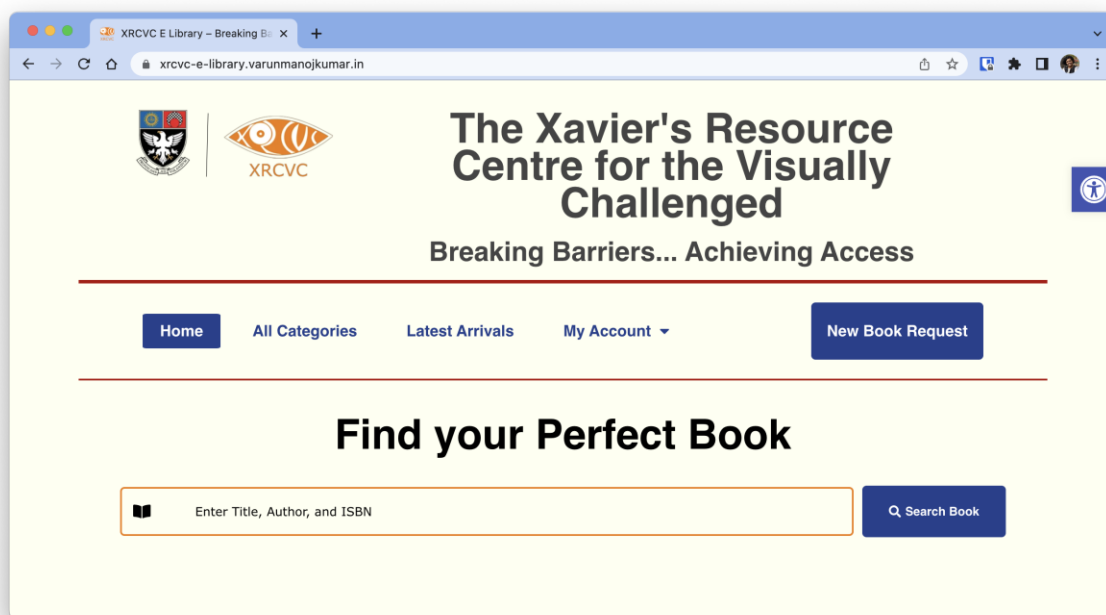

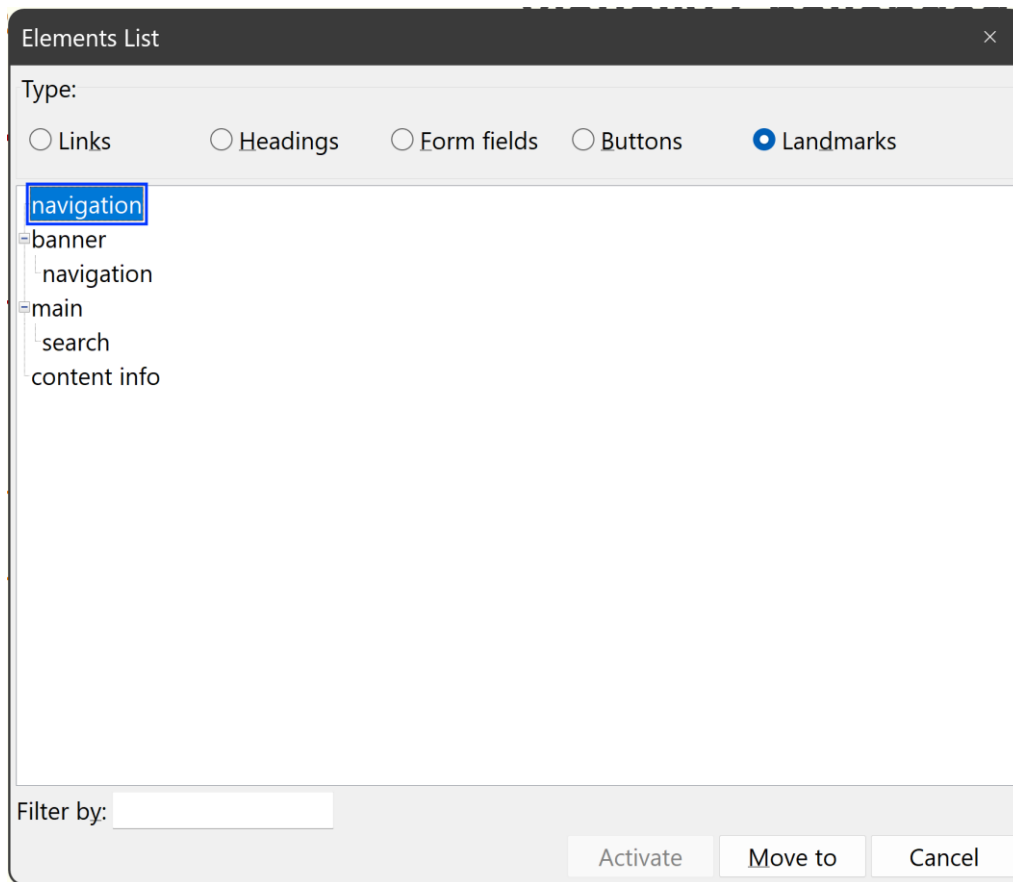


### 4.4.2 Semantic HTML and ARIA

Semantic HTML is considered the foundation of web accessibility. It greatly improves the experience of users that browse the web with assistive technology. This is because assistive technologies depend on the semantic structure and meaning of web pages to convey information to their users. Therefore, to ensure accessibility, semantic HTML should be used to define a meaningful structure that transcends what is visible through visual CSS styling. Although this may not make much difference to sighted users of the web, visually disabled users of the web rely on this to quickly navigate and understand the structure of web documents.

Like semantic HTML, ARIA is a W3 standard that helps make interfaces more accessible to people who use screen readers and other assistive technologies to consume content. ARIA attributes can be used to make unsemantic HTML more accessible to screen reader users.

We have used ARIA attributes for providing semantic markup to the website.



#### 4.4.3 jQuery for Accessibility

jQuery has been used to add ARIA attributes to various elements on the website to make them accessible and screen reader friendly. It has also been used to make the website keyboard friendly.

## 5 Feasibility Study

### 5.1 Technical Feasibility

The main objective of this feasibility study is to find out the applicability and possibility of using WordPress, a content management system used mainly for online blogging, to build an eLibrary Management System / Website for the XRCVC.

Based on our study, we find that compared to traditional specialized software, using WordPress for building a website has its unique advantages and disadvantages.

**Advantages :** The first and most well-known advantage of WordPress is that it is ease of use and its ability to customize. With the help of some plug-ins, the blogging tool can build a completely functional website with all necessary components. There are also large number of themes, either free or not, made explicitly for commercial purpose. Users only need to find which plug-ins and theme fit their business the most. Depend on user's preference, extra functions can be added or removed by install/uninstall plug-ins. The vast number of plug-ins and themes found on WordPress points out the high demand of using WordPress. Secondly, the software is totally free, with open source code. Hence, WordPress programming code can be accessed by anyone, so users with coding skill can change it to better accommodate their needs. Besides, the user interface of WordPress is rather friendly, so that even users with basic computer skills can still manage a website by their own. The software is also search engine optimizable as there are many plug-ins and guidelines available on the Internet.

**Disadvantages :** As those plug-ins are from different developers, there is a risk of incompatible when updating them or upgrading WordPress. Another disadvantage of WordPress, when compared to mainstream software, is security. Because of its popularity and open source characteristic, WordPress continually undergo many kinds of attack form hackers. For online business, security is of utmost importance and this disadvantage is seen as one of the biggest barrier that prevents online vendors from choosing WordPress. Finally, since WordPress is created and distributed freely, there is no official support channel by developers. The only available way to find help is through documentations on their website or in forums where users help each other.

Building a website has its costs and the exact cost of a website would depend on many factors, like the domain and hosting fees, server configuration, plugins used and level of complexity.

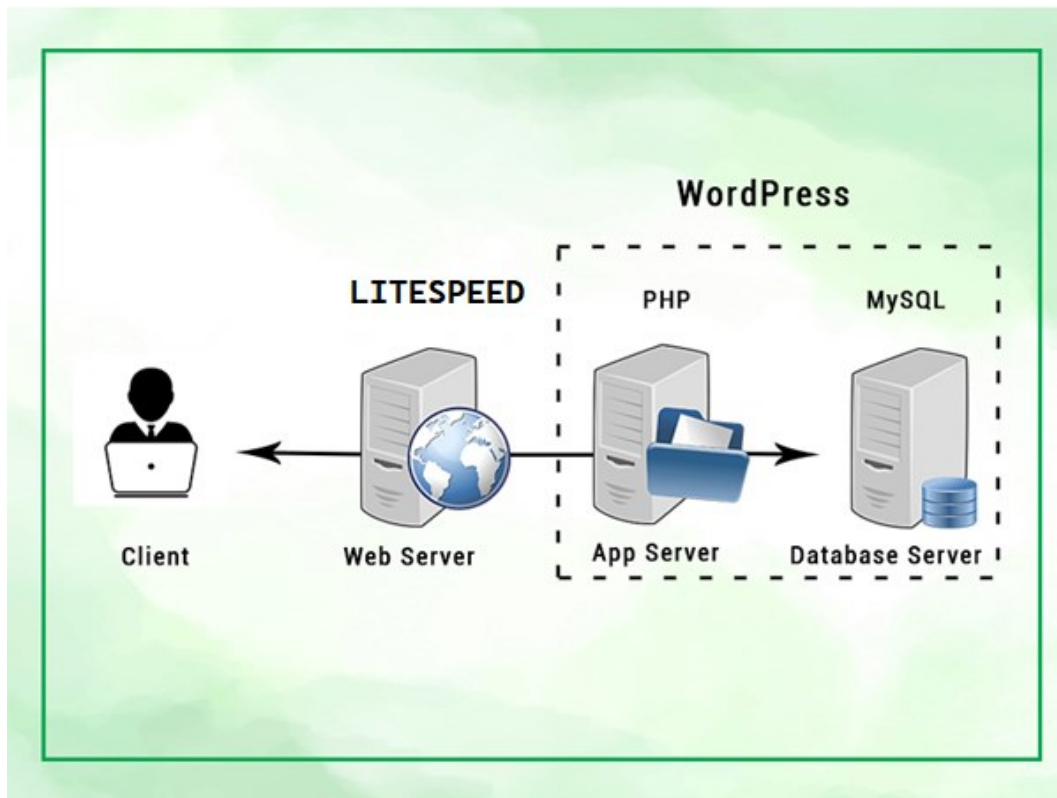
In this project, we have built the website using WordPress, a free content management system. While Wordpress is free, we need need to purchase a domain name and a web hosting plan. We have used Hostinger for the domain and hosting during the development phase in this project. Hostinger offers several plans for WordPress websites and we have used the “WordPress Starter” Plan.

WordPress Starter Plan cost – Rs. 149.00/month which includes free domain name for the first year.

For the deployment, XRCVC will host the website on their subdomain and we would migrate the website to their domain.

### 6.2 Domain Hosting

Web hosting is a must-have when it comes to getting your website live.

There are many types of hosting services available, such as shared hosting, WordPress hosting, and cloud hosting. The more popular a website is, the more resources it will need to function effectively.



We have hosted our website on [hostinger.com](https://hostinger.com). When we get a hosting plan, we rent an online space from a web host like [hostinger.com](https://hostinger.com) to store all of your website files. This will allow people to access our site using a web browser.

### 6.3 WordPress[2]



WordPress (WP or [WordPress.org](https://WordPress.org)) is a free and open-source content management system (CMS) written in hypertext preprocessor (PHP) language and paired with a MySQL or MariaDB database with supported HTTPS. Features include a plugin architecture and a template system, referred to within WordPress as "Themes". WordPress was originally created as a blog-publishing system but has evolved to support other web content types including more traditional mailing lists and Internet, media galleries, membership sites, learning management systems (LMS) and online stores. One of the most popular content management system solutions in use, WordPress is used by 42.8% of the top 10 million websites as of October 2021.

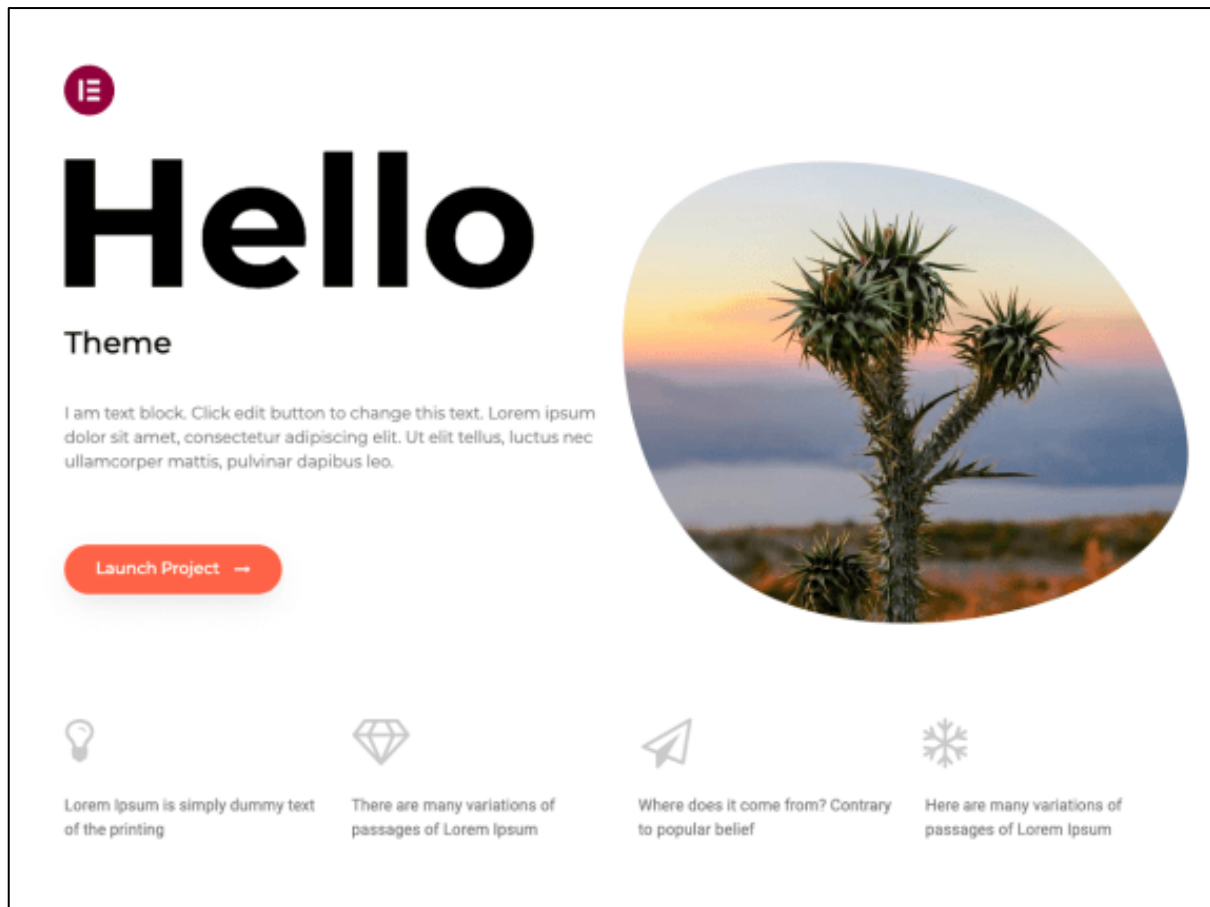
To function, WordPress has to be installed on a web server, either part of an Internet hosting service like Hostinger or a computer running the software locally.

#### 6.3.1 Themes Used

A WordPress theme is a collection of files that make up the foundation of the site's appearance, including page layouts, style sheets, and sidebar positioning. These files will dictate how pages appear to website visitors. Themes play a crucial role in an overall website's appearance and help create a good-looking site without having to code. Themes are often used to change the look and feel of a wide range of things at once, which makes them much less granular than allowing the user to set each option individually.

A new WordPress website comes with an installed default theme that is simple and lightweight. We can either use it or change it to a free or premium theme.

## Hello Elementor Theme



In this project, we have used the “Hello Elementor” theme. The Hello Theme is forever free and a great starting point to control and customize every part of any website you build with Elementor. Hello is free to download, loads quickly, and starts with minimal styling so you can customize it exactly the way you want.

Hello works in pure harmony with Elementor’s popular page builder and minimizes the need for other plugins. The theme loads in the blink of an eye, giving users a positive experience on the website. It offers a great responsive user experience across mobile, desktop, and tablet devices.

### 6.3.2 Plugins Used



WordPress' plugin architecture allows users to extend the features and functionality of a website or blog. As of December 2021, WordPress.org has 59,756 plugins available, each of



which offers custom functions and features enabling users to tailor their sites to their specific needs. However, this does not include the premium plugins that are available (approximately 1,500+), which may not be listed in the WordPress.org repository. These customizations range from search engine optimization (SEO) to client portals used to display private information to logged-in users, to content management systems, to content displaying features, such as the addition of widgets and navigation bars.

Most plugins are available through WordPress themselves, either via downloading them and installing the files manually via FTP or through the WordPress dashboard. However, many third parties offer plugins through their own websites, many of which are paid packages.

Plugins also represent a development strategy that can transform WordPress into all sorts of software systems and applications, limited only by the imagination and creativity of programmers. These are implemented using custom plugins to create non-website systems, such as headless WordPress applications and Software as a Service (SaaS) products.

#### 6.3.2.1 *Elementor Page Builder*



Elementor is the WordPress website builder that more than five million WordPress sites use to create content and designs with a visual, drag-and-drop editor. ## 6.4 jQuery

Also, jQuery has a number of built-in functions that can make it easier to add accessible features to a website, such as the ability to toggle ARIA attributes and add keyboard focus to elements.

This project uses jQuery to improve the accessibility of the website by manipulating the HTML DOM.

## 6.5 LiteSpeed WebServer

We have used LiteSpeed Webserver in our project.

LiteSpeed Web Server's cache engine is in-built into the server core and for WordPress purposes, it has its own LSCache plugin. LiteSpeed Web Server also provides built-in protection from large-scale WordPress Brute Force attacks.

Hence LiteSpeed is a perfect choice for WordPress Hosting.

## 6.6 Android with Java

Android apps are developed in the Java programming language using an IDE called Android Studio. Java is best suited for creating Android apps since it is platform-independent, and as a result, Java apps work on any platform. Java has its own runtime environment, Java Runtime Environment, as well as an API.

Android Studio is an IDE designed specifically for Android development. Android Studio provides a unified environment where you can build apps for Android phones, tablets, Android Wear, Android TV, and Android Auto. Structured code modules allow you to divide your project into units of functionality that you can independently build, test, and debug.

In this project we have developed an Android App using Java and Android Studio.

### 6.7.1 Firebase Realtime Database [8]

We have used the Firebase Realtime Database to dynamically change the website URLs in the Android Application without having to update the android application. This makes it easier to update the application at the time of production.

The Firebase Realtime Database is a cloud-hosted database. Data is stored as JSON and synchronized in realtime to every connected client. When you build cross-platform apps with our Apple platforms, Android, and JavaScript SDKs, all of your clients share one Realtime Database instance and automatically receive updates with the newest data.

### 6.7.2 Firebase App Check [7]

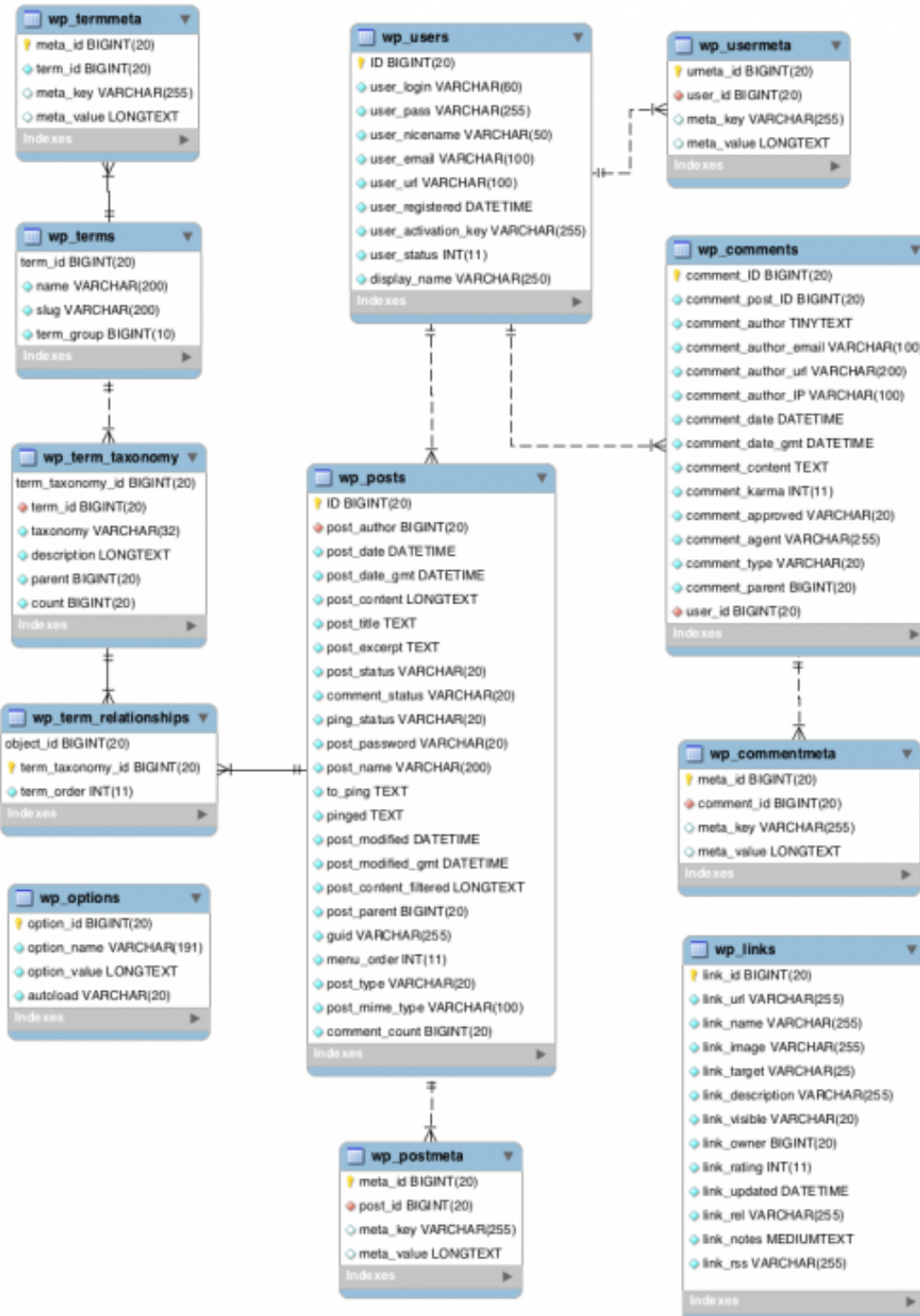

This project uses Firebase App Check in conjunction with type firebase, real-time database to protect the Real Time Database from unauthorized access.

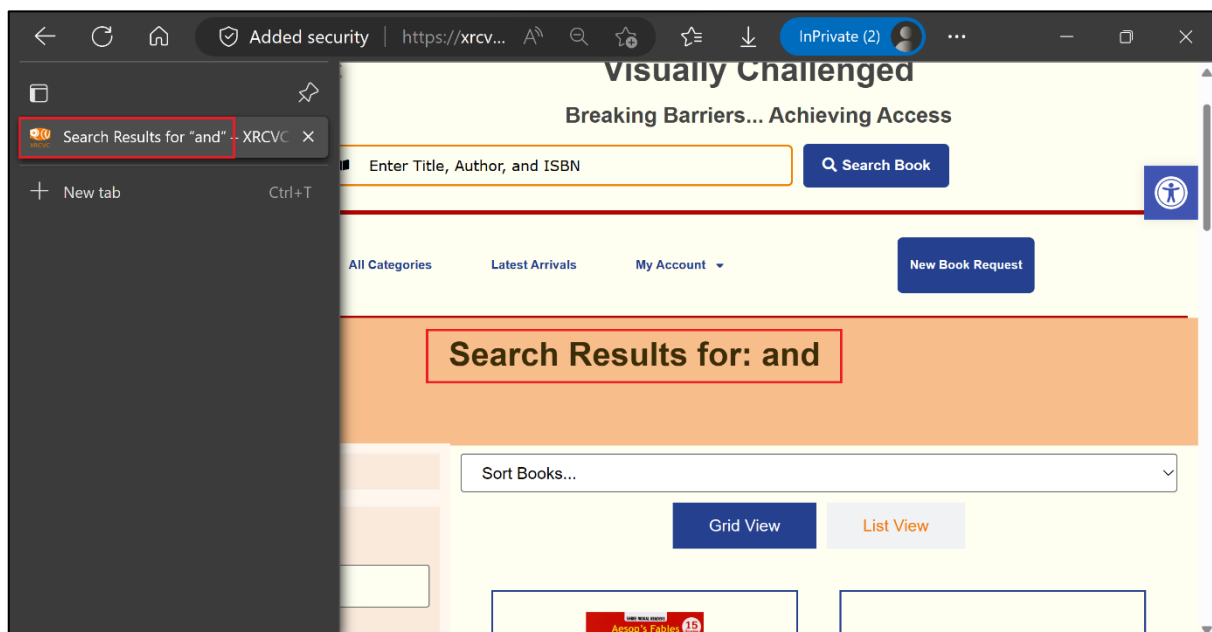

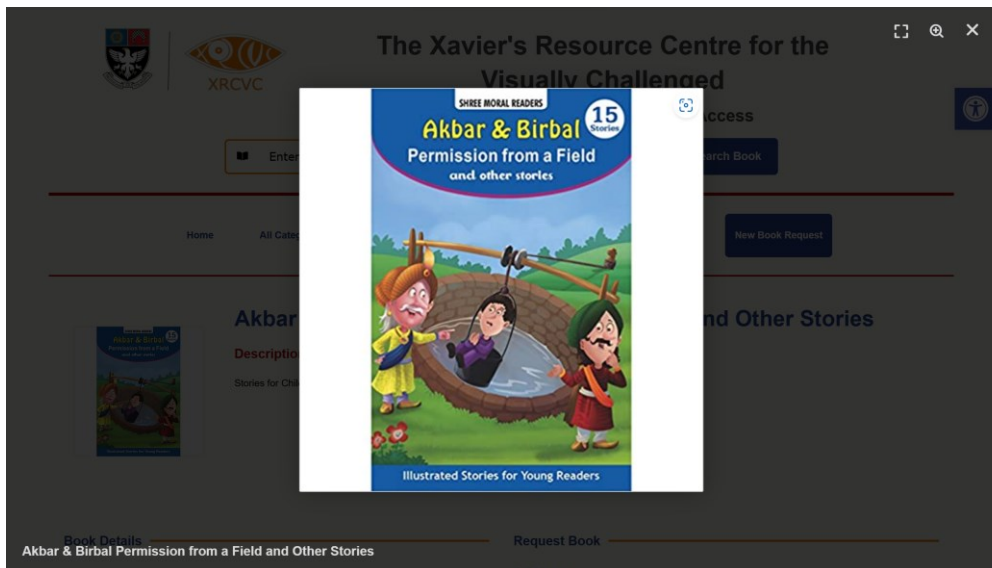



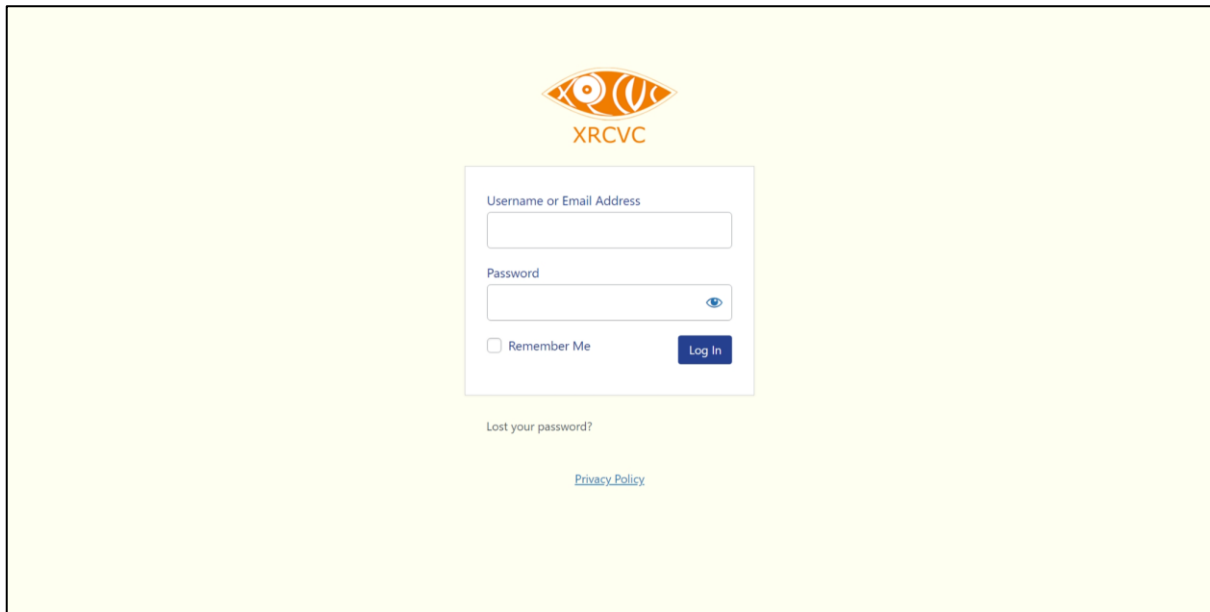

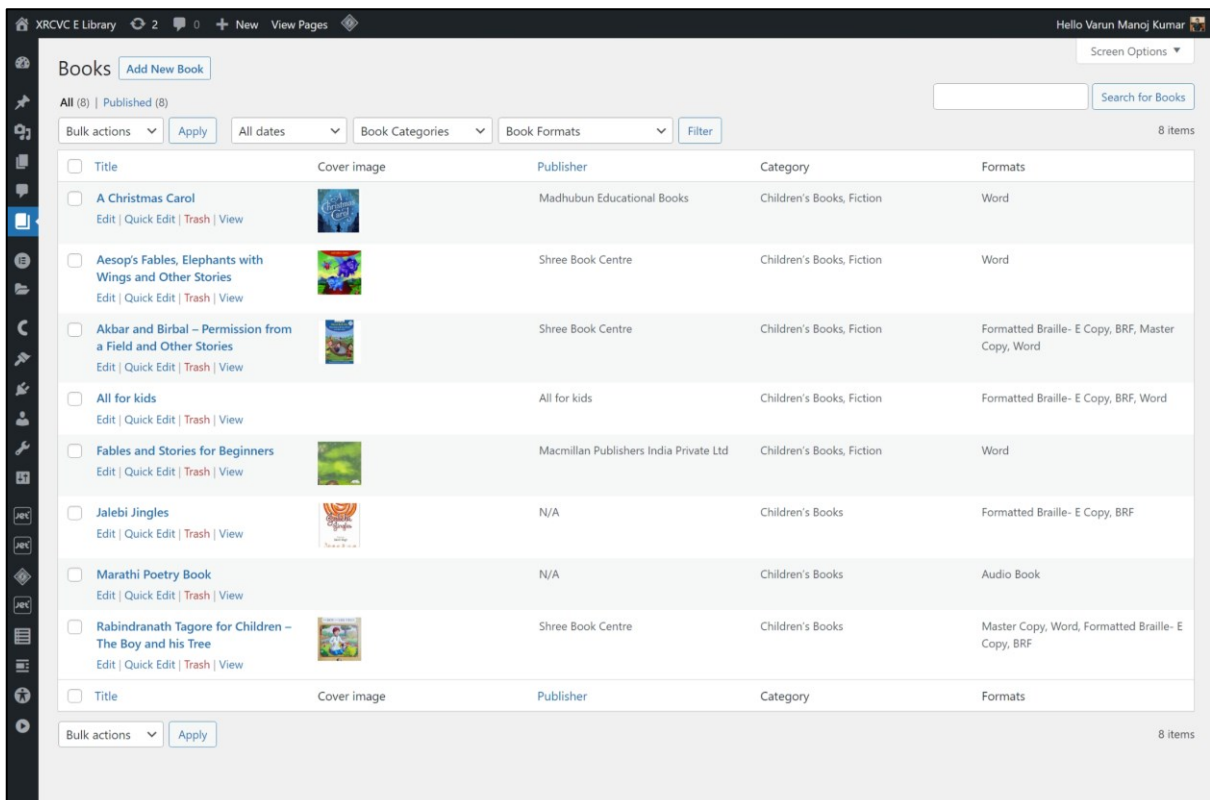

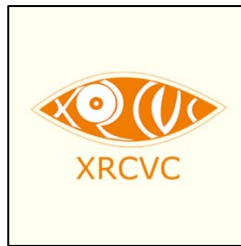

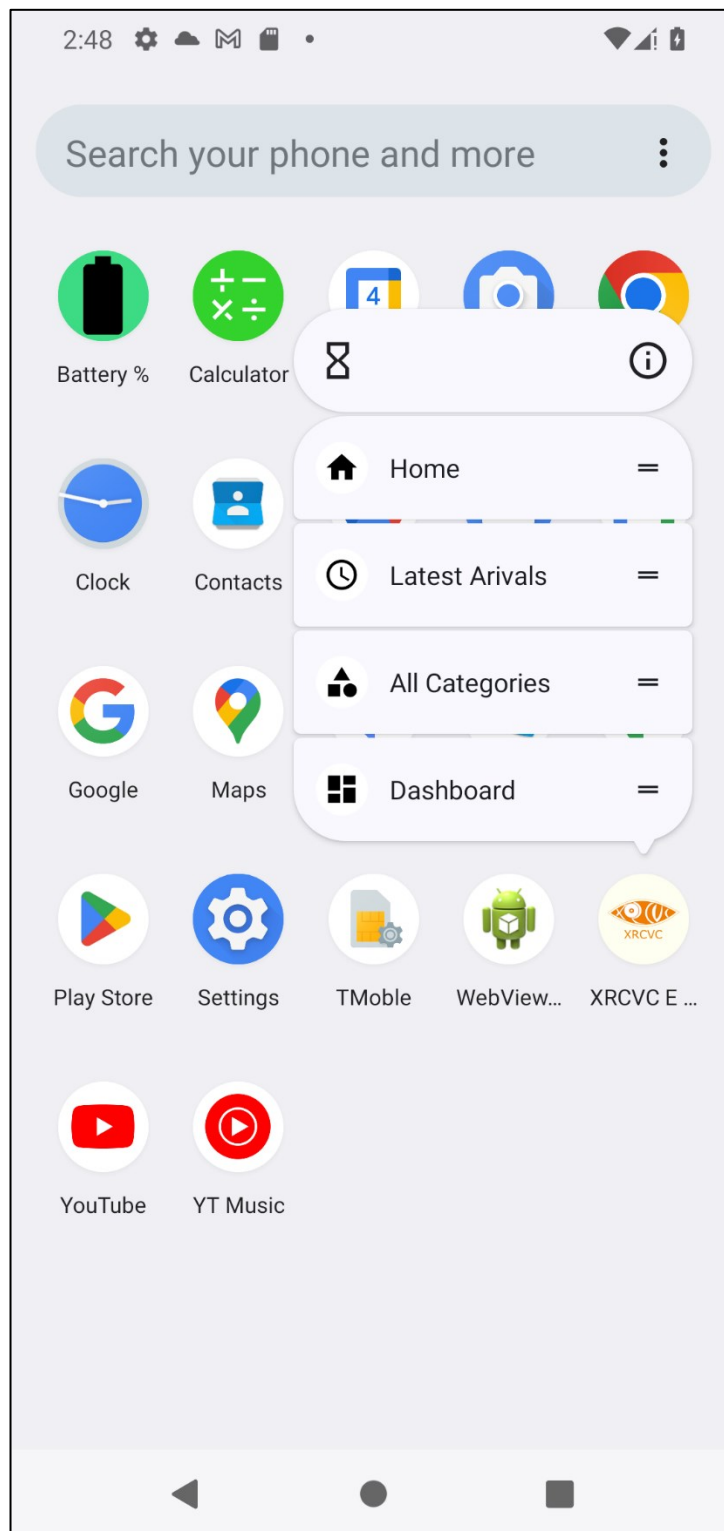

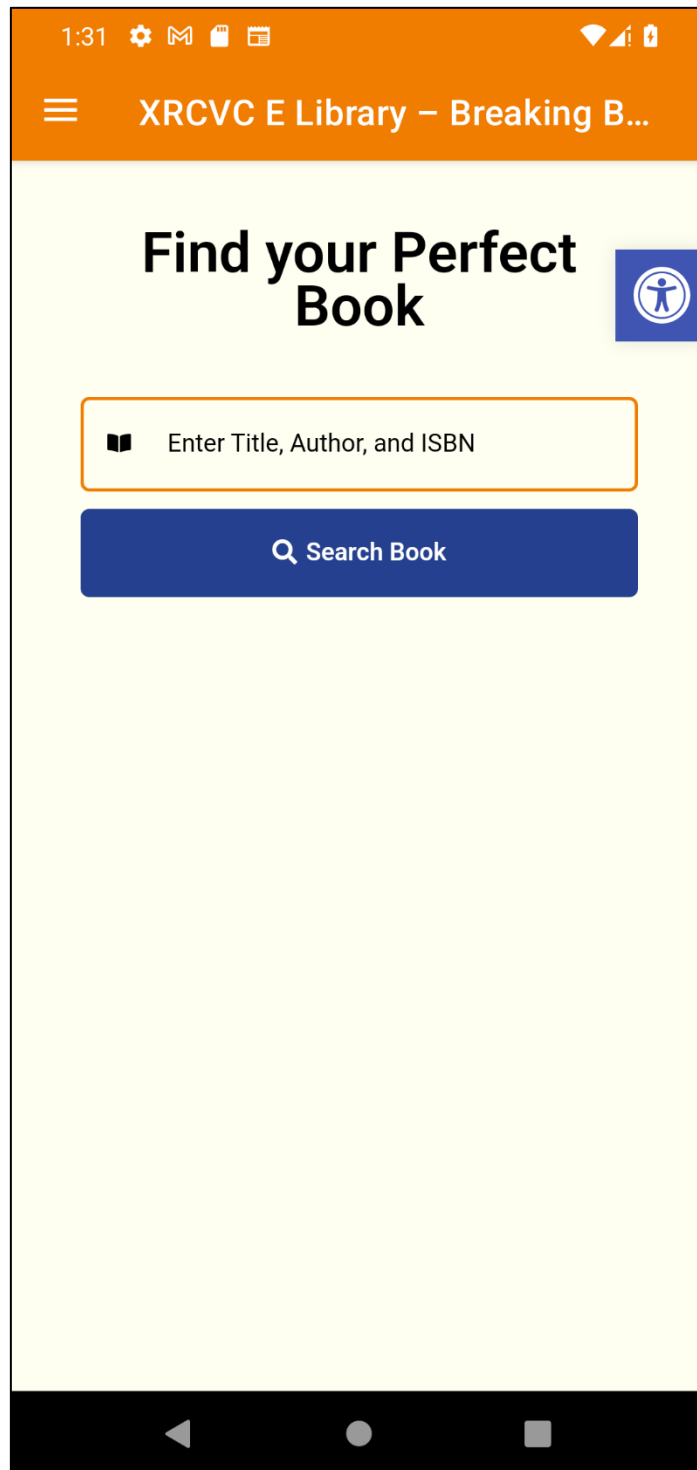

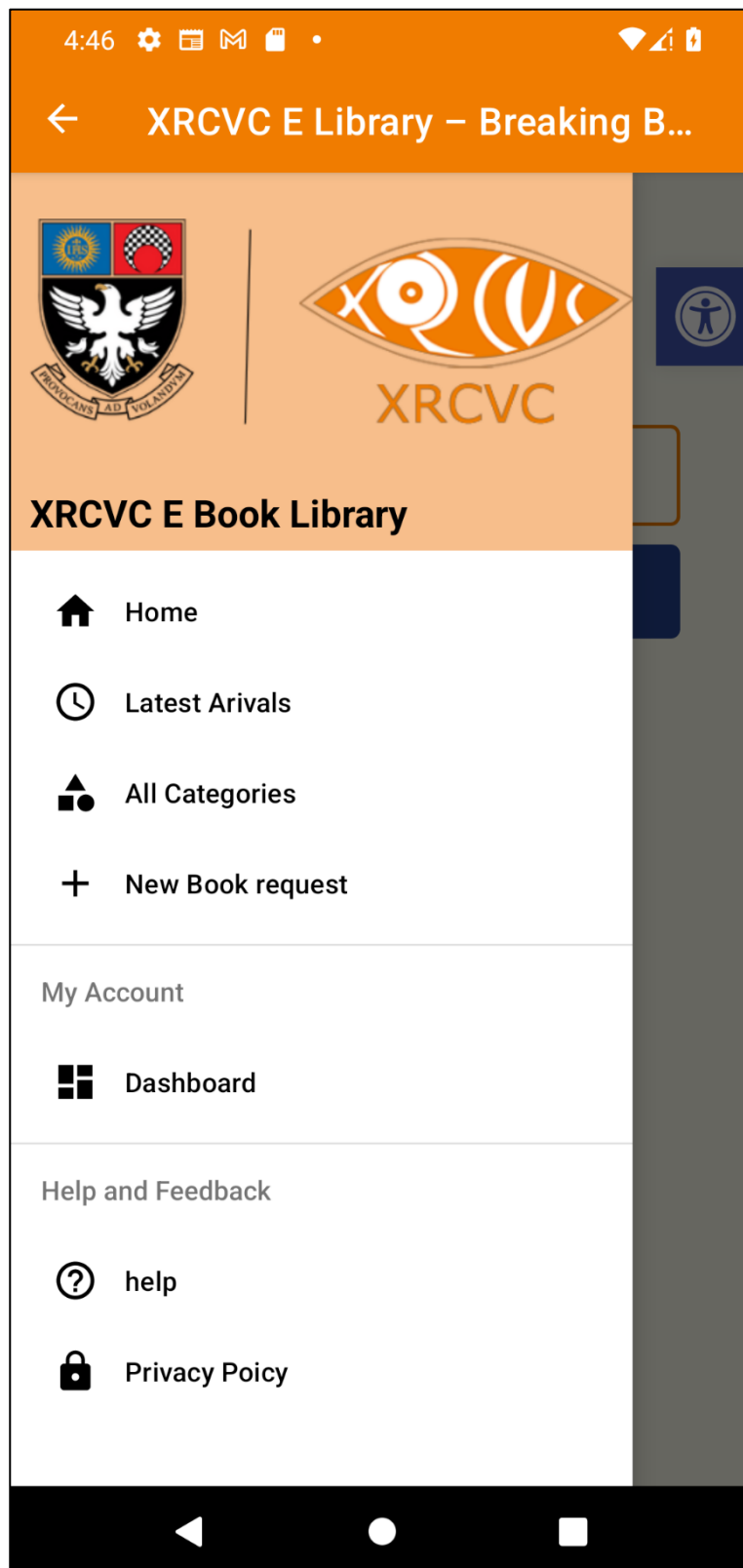

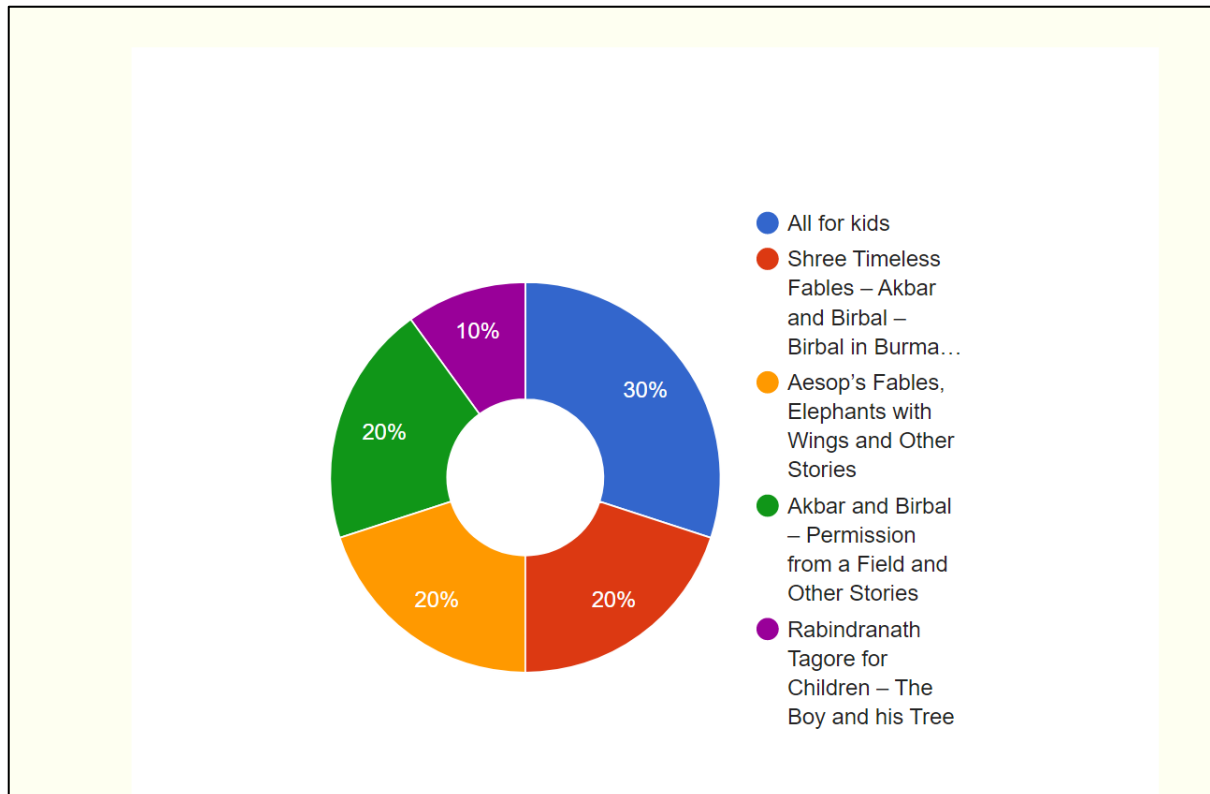


Figure 9-1 Pie Chart showing the distribution of various books requested.

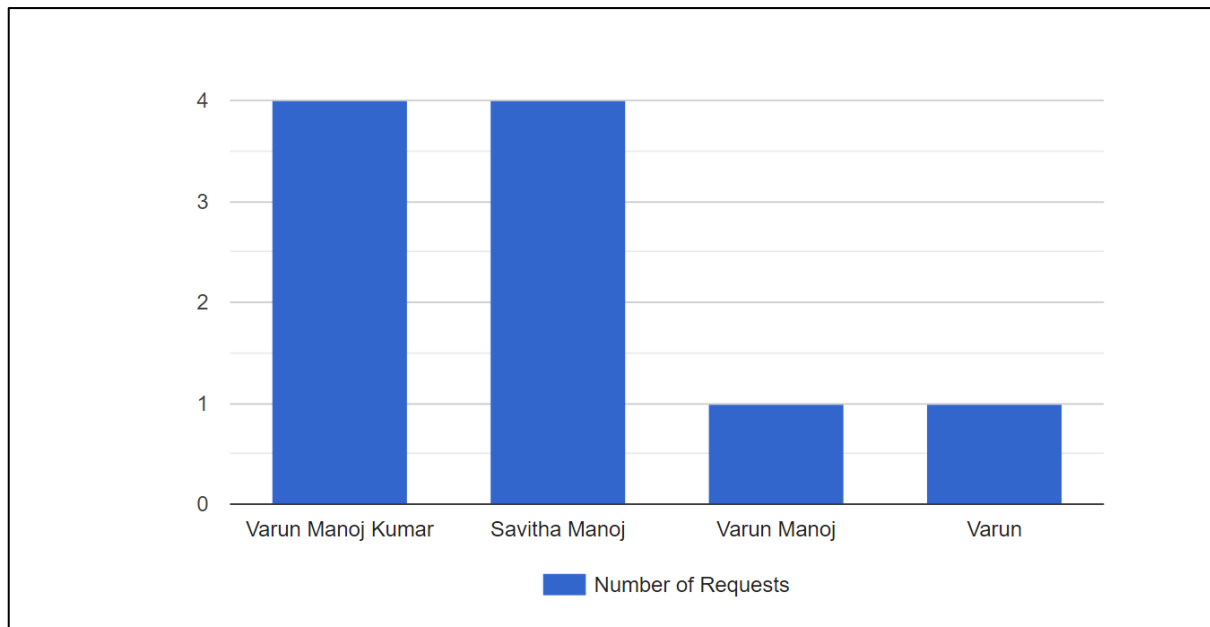


Figure 9-2 Bar Graph Showing the number of Books requested by Each Student

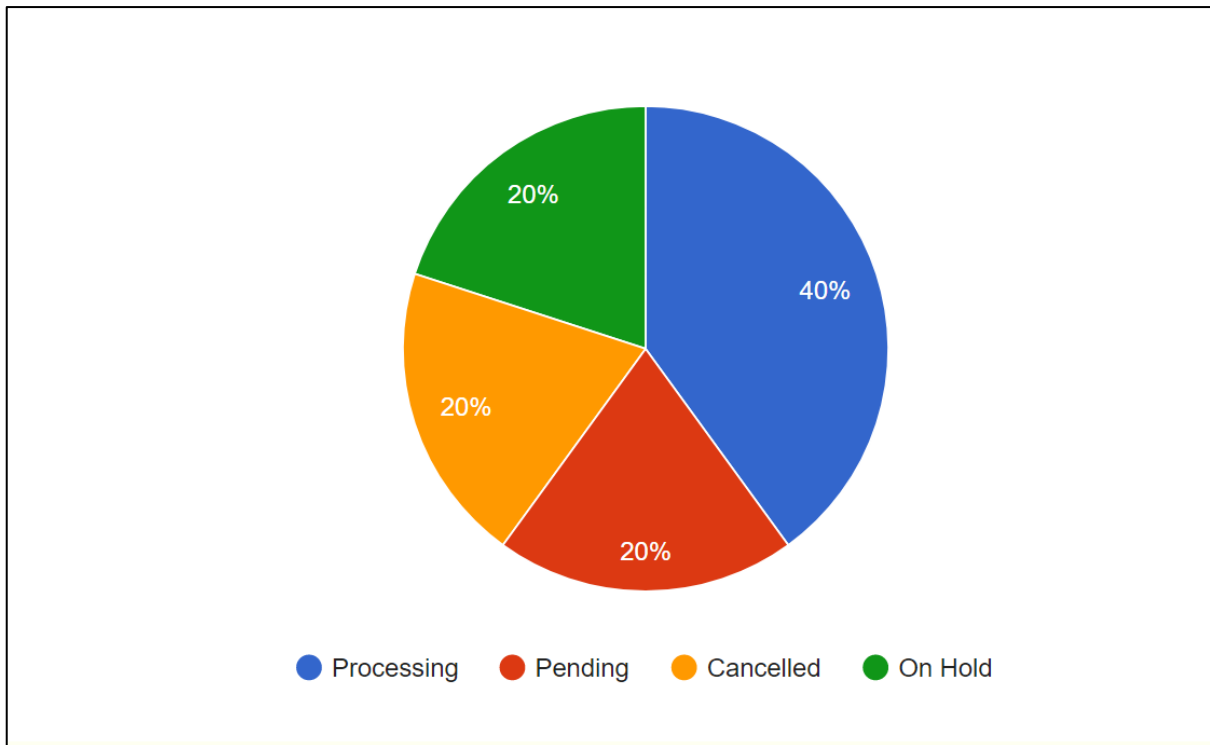


Figure 9-3 Pie Chart showing the Book Request Status

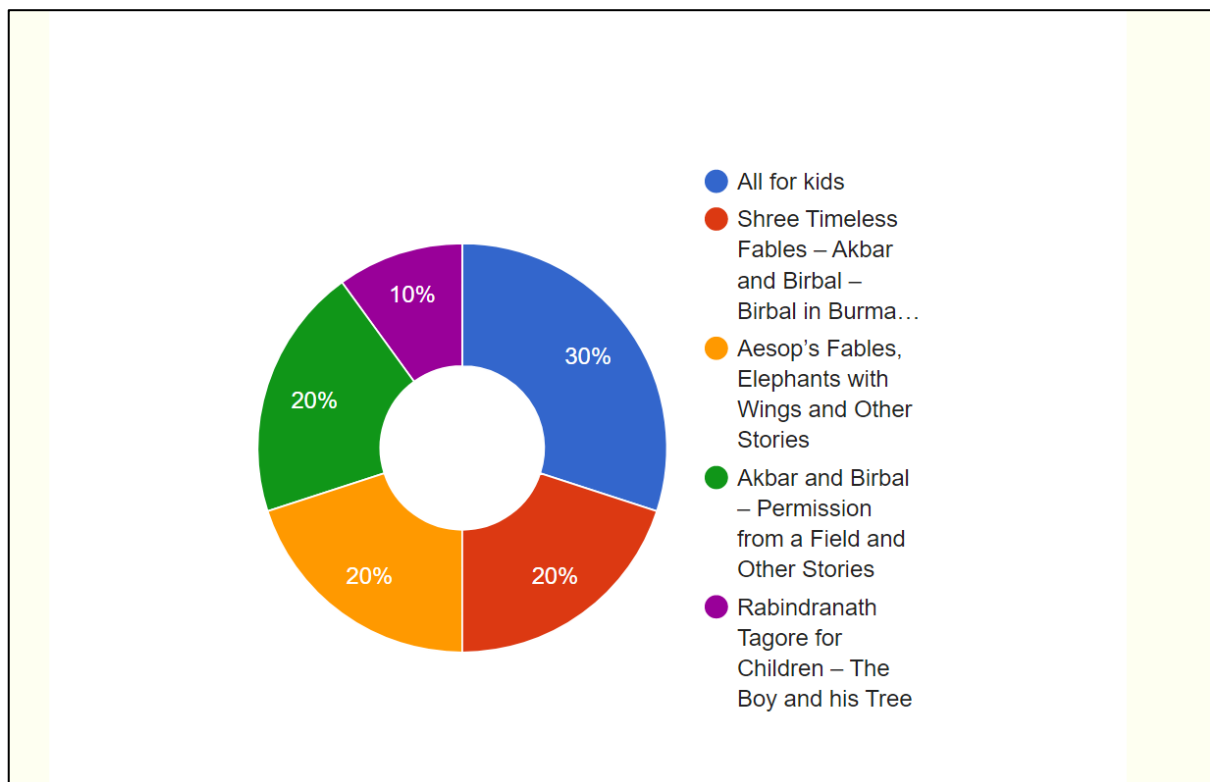

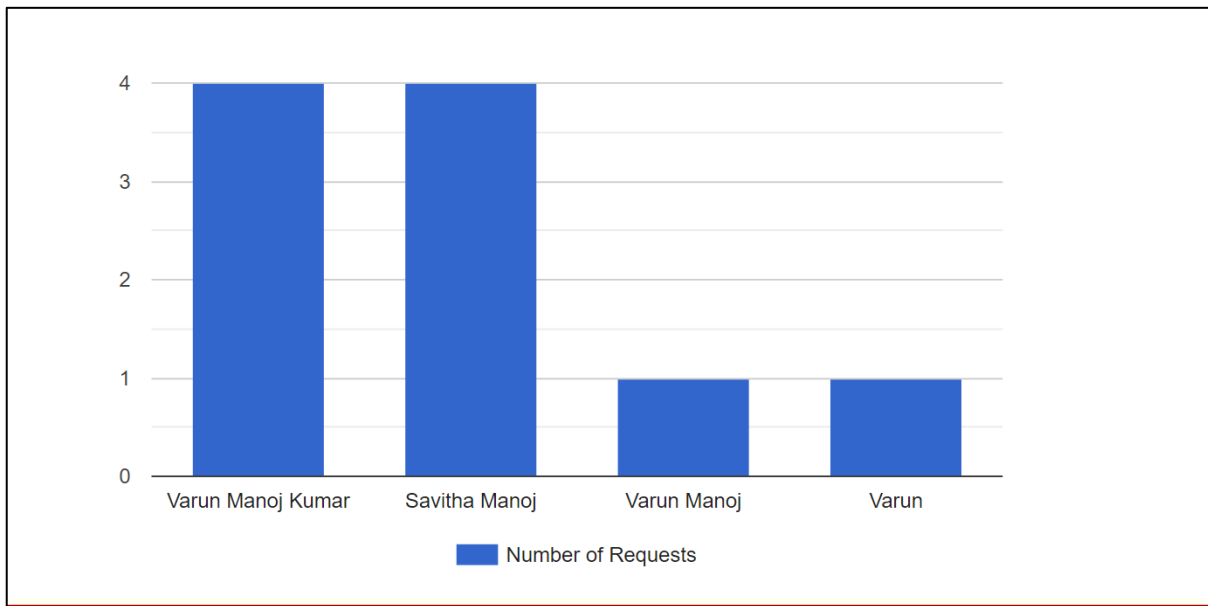
